#### **Epistle (New Testament) Reading**

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews.

Hebrews 12:18-29

You have not come to something that can be touched, a blazing fire, and darkness, and gloom, and a tempest, and the sound of a trumpet, and a voice whose words made the hearers beg that not another word be spoken to them. (For they could not endure the order that was given, "If even an animal touches the mountain, it shall be stoned to death." Indeed, so terrifying was the sight that Moses said, "I tremble with fear.") But you have come to Mount Zion and to the city of the living God, the heavenly Jerusalem, and to innumerable angels in festal gathering, and to the assembly of the firstborn who are enrolled in heaven, and to God the judge of all, and to the spirits of the righteous made perfect, and to Jesus, the mediator of a new covenant, and to the sprinkled blood that speaks a better word than the blood of Abel.

See that you do not refuse the one who is speaking; for if they did not escape when they refused the one who warned them on earth, how much less will we escape if we reject the one who warns from heaven! At that time his voice shook the earth; but now he has promised, "Yet once more I will shake not only the earth but also the heaven." This phrase, "Yet once more," indicates the removal of what is shaken-- that is, created things-- so that what cannot be shaken may remain. Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us give thanks, by which we offer to God an acceptable worship with reverence and awe; for indeed our God is a consuming fire.


# Have mercy, Lord, for we are sinners in your sight.

#### A Note on Today's Recessional Hymn

The tune popularly known as Austria was composed by Franz Joseph Haydn in 1797. The Rev. Pamela Werntz writes: "[The tune] served as Austria's national anthem until 1918. As early as 1802, American and English hymnals employed the tune for this hymn text by John Newton (who also wrote 'Amazing Grace'), first published in England in 1779. Because Nazi Germany used the tune for its national song, the tune now carries the unbearable weight of the Holocaust. In The Hymnal Companion to Evangelical Lutheran Worship, Paul Westermeyer writes that though Austria 'needs to be in hymnals for future generations, there are many circumstances where, because of its associations, this tune should not and cannot be sung." Today, we sing this tune as prepare to be sent forth into the world, praying that the power of God's love will heal the horrors of the past and empower us to work for justice.
