#### **About This Week's Music**

The **prelude** is a saraband by English composer and organist Francis Jackson. Originating in 16<sup>th</sup> century Spain, with Arab influences, the *zarabanda* was described by one Jesuit priest as "a dance and song so loose in its words and so ugly in its motions that it is enough to excite bad emotions in even very decent people." It spread to Italy and France in the 17th century, where it became the slow court dance we now know, like the one heard this morning. The **anthem** was composed for, and premiered at, the Coronation of Queen Elizabeth in 1953, and the **postlude** is from 17<sup>th</sup> century Spain. A *tiento* is a musical form from the 16<sup>th</sup> century (a contemporary of the saraband!), similar to the German *fantasia*, which showcased virtuosic passagework primarily on keyboard instruments.
