

The Lessons

Hebrew Bible (Old Testament) Reading

A reading from the Book of Exodus.

Exodus 24:12-18

The Lord said to Moses, "Come up to me on the mountain, and wait there; and I will give you the tablets of stone, with the law and the commandment, which I have written for their instruction." So Moses set out with his assistant Joshua, and Moses went up into the mountain of God. A reading from the second letter of Peter.


2 Peter 1:16-21

We did not follow cleverly devised myths when we made known to you the power and coming of our Lord Jesus Christ, but we had been eyewitnesses of his majesty. For he received honor and glory from God the Father when that voice was conveyed to him by the Majestic Glory, saying, "This is my Son, my Beloved, with whom I am well pleased." We ourselves heard this voice come from heaven, while we were with him on the holy mountain.

So we have the prophetic message more fully confirmed. You will do well to be attentive to this as to a lamp shining in a dark place, until the day dawns and the morning star rises in your hearts. 





Music During Black History Month

SPR seeks to program music which is inclusive, vibrant, and which reflects both our past and present journeys together. February offers a unique time to acknowledge the music of Black musicians. During this month, all preludes, postludes, choral anthems, and offertories will be Black musicians, and will be denoted with an "*" as a small step to increase the visibility of these under-represented artists and the music which contributes to our worship on a weekly basis.

February Music Fund Drive

Oxford University Press has just published a new collection of choral anthems, called **The** Oxford Book of Choral Music by Black **Composers.** It is a landmark collection of 35 non-idiomatic compositions from the sixteenth century to the present day, providing a comprehensive introduction to an area of choral music that has been historically underrepresented. About This Week's Music

The **prelude** and **postlude** are tunes by Henry Roeland Byrd, better known as "Professor Longhair." He was a maverick in the New Orleans jazz scene, influencing others, such as Fats Domino and Dr. John. In 1987, he was awarded a posthumous Grammy, and was inducted into the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1992. The anthem is by Roderick Williams. While his career as a singer has taken him around the world (catch him performing Bach's St. Matthew Passion with Chicago's Music of the Baroque in April), he has been building a substantial catalogue as a composer, specializing in choral music. Exultate was a 2020 commission by the UKbased chorus of the same name, and premiered in 2021.

About Our Guest Musicians

Richard Brasseale is a saxophonist in the Chicagoland area who has played with many different groups, including the Milwaukee Symphony, Madison Symphony, and the Civic Orchestra of Chicago. This year also includes performances with the Northwest Indiana Symphony, and the New World Symphony. He currently teaches saxophone and chamber music at North Park University. Sarah Christianson is a classical percussionist and timpanist who performs with numerous ensembles throughout Chicagoland.
